Art, and Marko Klomp's paintings in particular, offer the opportunity to escape for a while, but also to pause. They create a moment of calm where "lonely" may mean "alone," and alone does not have to be bad. Painted landscapes in particular work like this, they have meaning because they appeal to the identity of the viewer. But it is also the viewer who gives meaning to the landscape.

Gallery Sorelle Sciarone is a contemporary art gallery that organizes colorful and evocative art exhibitions. From an art-historical perspective, we research contemporary Dutch artists' oeuvre.
